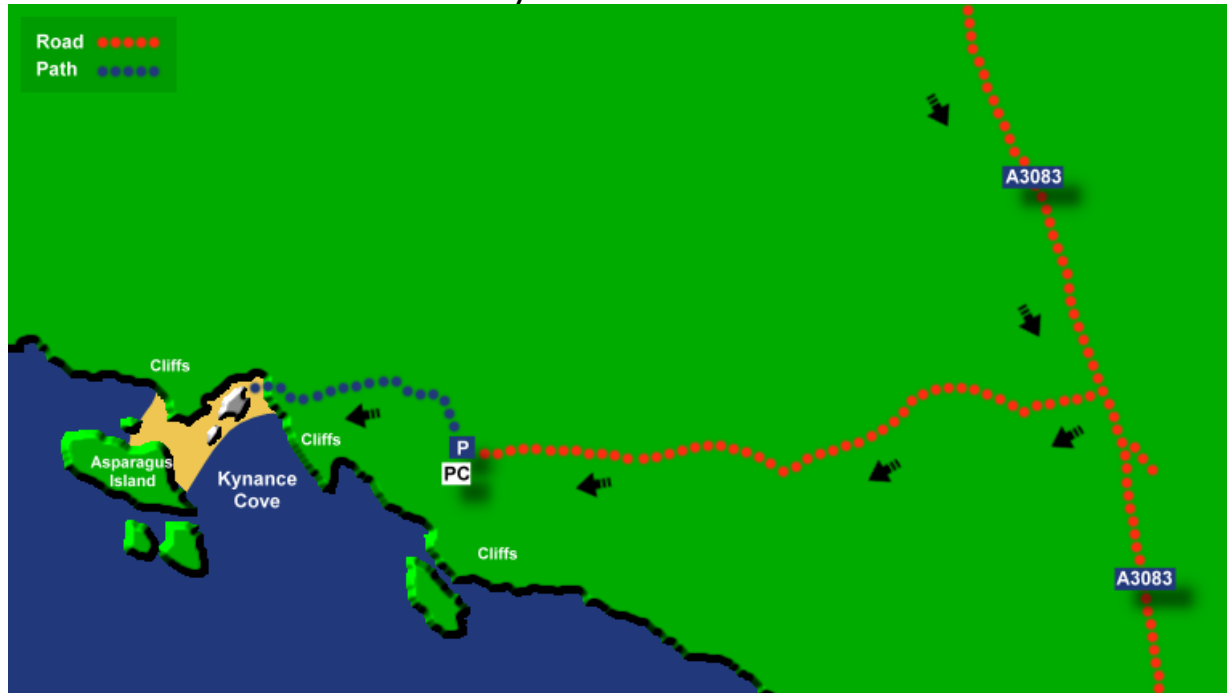


Kynance Cove



- Description: Kynance Cove is a picturesque cove with a pleasant sandy beach, which at low tide extends to Asparagus Island
- Safety: Signs warn of rip currents and not to bathe at low tide, near rocks or in rough seas. Also do not use inflatables. Danger of being cut off by high tide
- Access: National Trust parking and toilets are a 10 minute walk from the beach and the path down is sloping. The final steps down to the beach at Kynance Cove are steep
- Dogs: Dogs are banned on Kynance Beach from Easter Day to October 1 (7am to 7pm)
- Directions: Kynance Cove is approximately 11 miles from Helston. Approach Helston on the A394 from the east or west. Alternatively drive to Redruth on the A30 and at Redruth take the B3297 to Helston. At Helston follow the A3083 to Lizard. Shortly before the Lizard village turn right onto the road for Kynance Cove (signposted to Kynance Cove)
- Parking: 1 reasonably sized NT car park at Kynance Cove
- Toilets: Yes, at the car park
- Facilities: Café at Kynance Cove, by the beach
- Activities: None

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
