

- Description:Trevaunance Cove is a nice sandy cove with a large area of rocks to the east of the cove. The beach is popular with families and surfers, but note that the car parks can get full on summer days. There are plenty of facilities close to the beach and there are nice seating areas above the beach where you can enjoy the view
- Safety:Lifeguards in summer. Signs warn of strong undercurrents and falling cliffs
- Access: Access to the beach is via the road down to the beach, which becomes a slipway to the beach. The road and slipway are fairly steep and not suitable for wheelchairs
- Dogs:Dogs allowed all year at Trevaunance Cove, but should be kept on leads during summer
- Directions:Trevaunance Cove is close to St Agnes which is 12 miles from Newquay and 9 miles from Redruth. Use the A30 from the east or west. At the Chiverton Cross roundabout (about 8 miles from Redruth) turn onto the B3277 the road to St Agnes. At St Agnes at a mini roundabout turn right. Proceed through St Agnes on this road which becomes one-way. Past the church, follow the road down to another roundabout. Here turn left (signposted to "The Beach" and Trevaunance Cove) onto Quay Road and follow this road down to Trevaunance Cove. On the way back, drive back up Quay Road and at the roundabout turn right and immediately turn left onto British Road, following the signs for Truro and Redruth onto the one-way system
- Parking:1 small car park right by the beach and 1 small car park a 5 minute walk away from the beach
- Toilets:Yes, just above the slipway
- Facilities:Beach shop, café, restaurant at Trevaunance Cove
- Activities:Surfing
