

- Description:Portnadler Bay is a scenic bay to the west of Looe. There is a long sand and shingle beach with many rock pools which is usually quiet due to difficult access and no facilities
- Safety:No details available
- Access: Access is via a 30 minute walk on the coast path from Hannafore Point, to the
  west of Looe. The coast path is steep in places. The final steps to the beach are very
  steep
- Dogs:Dogs allowed all year on Portnadler Beach
- Directions:Looe is 18 miles from Plymouth. Take the A38 from Plymouth over the Tamar Bridge into South East Cornwall. At Trerulefoot, turn onto the A374 (signposted to Looe). After approximately 1 mile, turn right onto the A387 (again signposted to Looe). At Widegates the A387 becomes the B3253 for Looe. Continue on this road to Looe. At Looe immediately after the bridge turn left and follow the road to Hannafore Point. Park at Hannafore Point and walk the coast path west
- Parking:Road parking at Hannafore Point
- Toilets:No toilets. Nearest toilets are at Hannafore Point
- Facilities: None, café at at Hannafore Point
- Activities: None
