

- Description:Gwynver Beach is a scenic white sand beach just north of Sennen Cove. Gwynver Beach is a really nice beach, which can be surfed, but there are no facilities and the path down is very steep. At low tide the sand stretches south to Sennen Cove
- Safety:Lifeguards in summer. Signs warn of strong rip currents, large breaking waves and not to use inflatables when windy. Also risk of falling rocks from the cliffs
- Access:There is a very steep path from the car park to the beach, taking about 10 minutes to walk
- Dogs:Dogs allowed all year at Gwynver Beach
- Directions: Gwynver Beach is close to Sennen Cove, which is about 9 miles from Penzance. Follow the A30 around the outskirts of Penzance, then follow the A30 to Sennen Cove and Lands End. About a mile before the turning to Sennen Cove, take a right turning for the Gwynver car park. Note that this turning is not signposted to Gwynver, but there is a sign post to Tregiffian Farm. Follow this road for about a mile to the Gwynver Beach car park. You can also park at Sennen Cove and walk the coast path to Gwynver Beach
- Parking:1 car park above Gwynver Beach
